The Pennsylvania Project

The proposed Pennsylvania High-Speed Maglev Project is a 47-mile high-speed magnetic levitation transportation system from Pittsburgh International Airport to Greensburg with MAGport™ stations located at the Airport, Downtown Pittsburgh, Monroeville and Greensburg. The system would take passengers from Greensburg to the Airport in under 28 minutes.

This project is the initiative of MAGLEV, Inc., a private for profit company, which has advanced the High-Speed Maglev Project for more than a decade. The Pennsylvania High-Speed Maglev Project is a public/private partnership between Port Authority of Allegheny County, MAGLEV, Inc., and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation in cooperation with the Federal Railroad Administration.
